Plans to mine the deposit would impact sacred Native American cultural sites, water, and habitat home to endangered and threatened species. In capturing the land before the mine, Osha allows us to see and appreciate the real costs modern life.

Osha's work has appeared in National Geographic, Scientific American, Rolling Stone, Sierra and many other print and online venues. His Arizona landscape images were selected for display at the Sandra Day O'Connor United States Courthouse and elsewhere. He lives in Phoenix.
