Partha Dasgupta taught at the London School of Economics from 1971-84 before moving to the University of Cambridge in 1985. From 1989-92 he was Professor of Economics, Professor of Philosophy, and Director of the Program in Ethics in Society at Stanford University; and from 1991-97 he served as chairman of the (Scientific Advisory) board of the Beijer International Institute of Ecological Economics, Stockholm.

Dasgupta's research interests include welfare and development economics, the economics of technological change; population, environmental, and resource economics; game theory; and the economics of undernutrition. Publications include *Guidelines for Project Evaluation* (with S.A. Marglin and A.K. Sen; UN 1972), *Economic Theory and Exhaustible Resources* (with G.M. Heal; Cambridge University Press 1979; *The Control of Resources* (Harvard University Press 1982); *An Inquiry into Well-Being and Destitution* (Clarendon Press, Oxford, 1993); *Human Well-Being and the Natural Environment* (Oxford University Press, 2001; revised edition, 2004); and *Economics: A Very Short Introduction* (Oxford University Press 2007).

Dasgupta is a Foreign Member of the American Philosophical Society (2005), Fellow of the Royal Society (2004), Fellow of the Third World Academy of Sciences (2001), Foreign Associate of the US National Academy of Sciences (2001), European Economic Association (1999), past President of the Royal Economic Society (1998-2001), Member of the Pontifical Academy of Social Sciences (1998), Honorary Member of the American Economic Association (1997), Honorary Fellow of the London School of Economics (1995), Foreign Member of the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences (1991), Foreign Honorary Member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences (1991), Fellow of the British Academy (1989), and Fellow of the Econometric Society (1975). He was named Knight Bachelor by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in 2002.
