Dr. Dave D. White is associate professor in the Arizona State University (ASU) School of Community Resources and Development, and principal investigator and director of the Decision Center for a Desert City. His research and engagement is focused on developing, implementing, and studying processes, outcomes, and institutional forms to link knowledge to action for sustainability.

Dr. White also holds appointments at ASU as senior sustainability scientist with the Julie Ann Wrigley Global Institute of Sustainability, and as affiliate faculty with the Consortium for Science, Policy, and Outcomes and the School of Public Affairs. In 2014, Dr. White was awarded the Celebrating Natural Resources Award from the University of Idaho. He holds a Ph.D. from Virginia Tech, his M.S. from the University of Idaho, and a B.S. from George Mason University.
