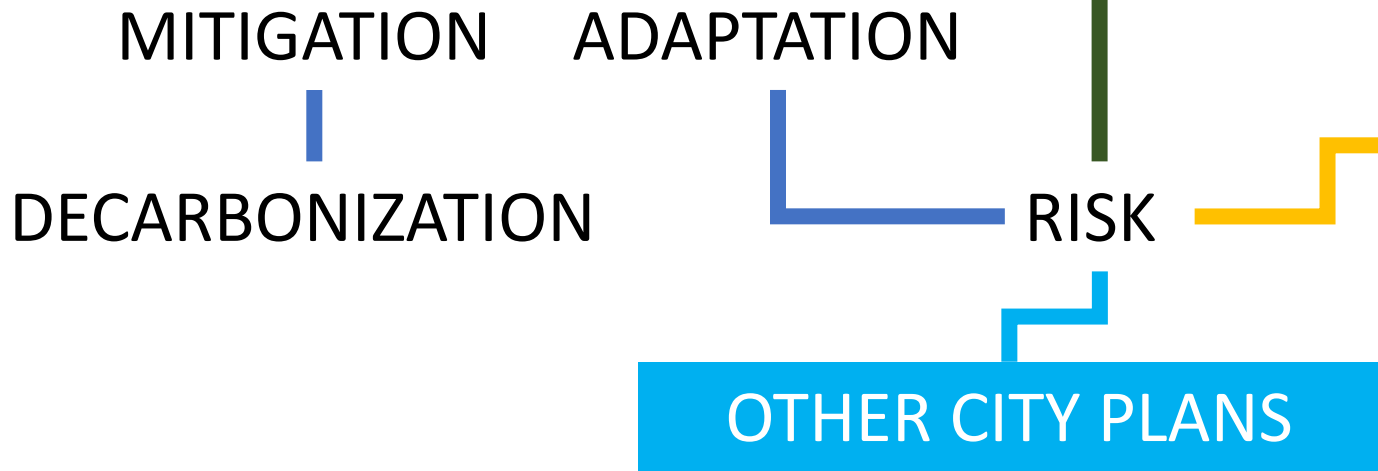
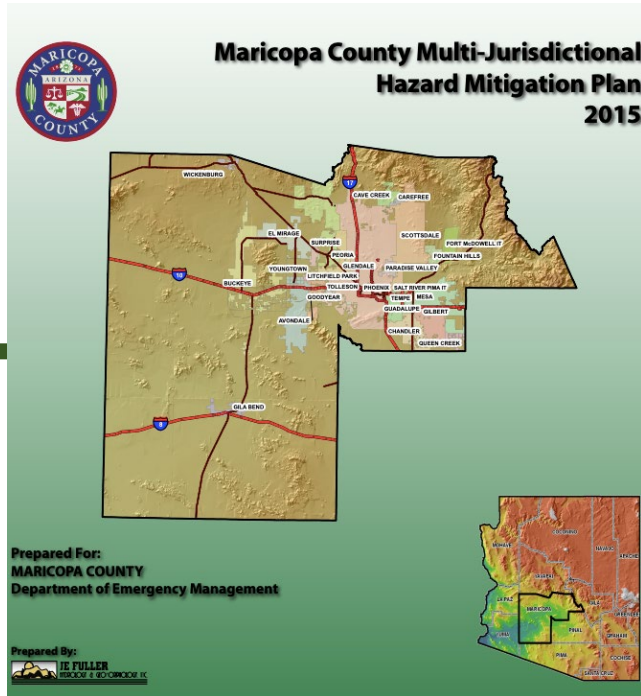
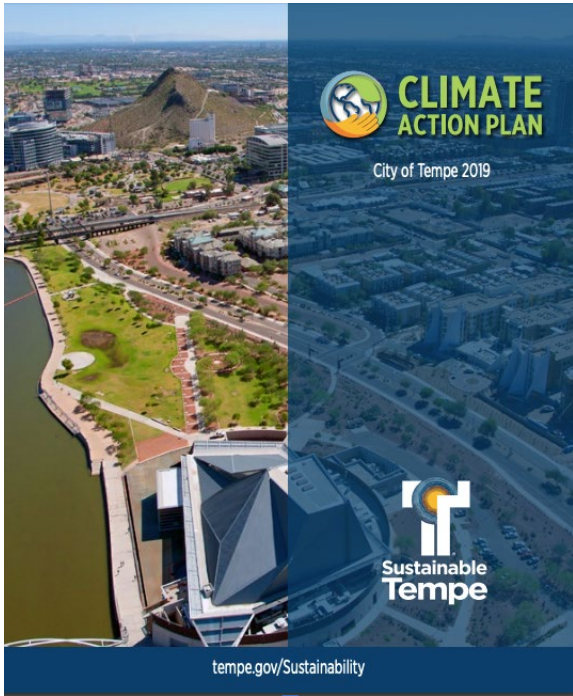

- Time to include climate in all plans
 - Climate action plans (CAPs) focus on mitigating GHGs
 - Adaptation plans → preparing for the impacts of climate change
 - Resilience plans → enhance abilities to cope with shocks and stresses

7 Principles for Strong Plans

- Set ambitious, yet achievable goals
- Provide a strong fact base, using the best available data
- Outline diverse strategies to achieve goals
- Engage the public and foster justice
- Coordinate efforts across actors, sectors, and plans
- Include a clear process for implementation and monitoring
- Address climate change uncertainty

Maricopa County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (MCMJHMP)

- What is the MCMJHMP?
 - Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan for all of Maricopa County
 - Identifies natural hazards that impact communities
 - Identifies potential mitigation projects/actions
- What is the development and update process?
 - Updated every 5 years
 - 2 year planning cycle

MCMJHMP Planning Partners

- Traditional planning partners
 - All city/towns in Maricopa County + 2 tribes and SRP
- Potential planning invitees
 - Subject Matter Experts
 - Non-Governmental Organizations

MCMJHMP Community Involvement

- How can communities contribute?
 - Risk Profiles and Consequence Analysis
 - Mitigation efforts
- Going forward (vision and areas for improvement)
 - Federal guidance
 - Continue inclusion of whole community
 - Public Involvement
